



Feature differences between an Administrator and a User within a Profile

Administrators have global access to the Netcleanse server and can affect changes to all configuration including profiles.

Users within Profiles have limited access to configuration settings as outlined below. The specific configuration settings within a profile override the global settings for these features and will only affect user(s) within the profile. All global settings which can only be configured by the Administrator remain the same. Profiles can be built for: a single user, a group of users, a domain and multiple domains, as needed.
